### NOTE !!

The 2012-2013 UC Admissions Application is considered the only scholarship application for Fall 2012 prospective students. Thus prospective Fall 2012 students do not apply on this application.

### Undergraduate Scholarship Program

Scholarships are awarded on a competitive basis, selected by the Faculty Committee on Undergraduate Scholarships and Honors.

Although every effort is made to present the most accurate and up-to-date information, the information contained herein is subject to change due to federal, state, and university funding limitations or changes in policy and procedure.

### Who is Eligible?

- ▶ 2011-2012 UCSD undergraduates, enrolled full-time in 2012-2013
- ▶ U.S. citizen/permanent resident (except for the Lima Scholarship).
- ▶ Beginning January 2012, UCSD students who are not US citizens or permanent residents, but who are exempt from paying Non-Resident Supplemental Tuition under AB540, may be considered for some UCSD scholarships.
- ▶ **GPA:** 3.6+ for merit awards, 3.0+ for all other awards
- ▶ Completed less than 15 quarters of college attendance
- ▶ Preference to Non-Regents, Non-Jacobs, and Non-Chancellors Scholars
- ▶ File a FAFSA by March 2, 2012 for financial need awards. (Additional requested financial aid documents due May 1)
- ▶ If you check scholarship boxes for which you obviously do not meet the stated criteria, your application will NOT be considered.
- ▶ One scholarship awarded per student.

### How Do I Submit the Application?

- Under the "Tools" (green bar- middle of page) click "Financial Aid"
- Enter your User ID & Password
- Click the button "2012-13 Continuing Undergraduate Scholarship Application"
- Follow step-by-step instructions
- Must complete resume, essay, and supplemental essay. Exception: For Merit or Financial Need only awards - can enter "NONE" in appropriate sections.
- Changes can be made up to deadline

### What Does This Application Do?

With this ONE application you will automatically be considered for:

- ▶ ALL Merit awards
- ▶ ALL Financial Need awards (if you are a financial aid recipient)
- ▶ ALL Restricted awards for which you checked the appropriate boxes

# On-Line Application

## ► Part I & II: Student Information (Required)

For **Career Plans** Enter title of career only (e.g. Engineer). Do not use "I plan to..."

## ► Part III: Restricted Scholarships

Part III is a list of scholarships.

**Only apply for those scholarships for which you meet the criteria.**

If you select scholarships for which you **obviously** do not meet the stated criteria, your application will NOT be considered.

Scholarships marked with an asterisk (\*) require additional information. A box will be provided under the scholarship description for this information - up to 3,000 words (includes spaces).

## ► Part IV: Resume (Required)

**Exception: For Merit or Financial Need Scholarship Only -** you can enter "None" in Resume for the application to be considered "Complete."

For all other scholarships the Resume is mandatory. The Resume includes four areas:

- 1) Honors /awards
- 2) Extracurricular activities (clubs, organizations)
- 3) Community service
- 4) Employment / internships

You can list activities for the past 3 years including high school except Alumni Scholarships that require College level activities. Be sure to read the scholarship criteria carefully.

Indicate start and stop dates, or "ongoing." (Sample Resume attached).

## ► Part V: Essay (Required)

**Exception: For Merit or Financial Need Scholarship Only -** you can enter "None" in Resume for the application to be considered "Complete."

For all other scholarships the Essay is mandatory. The Essay should be well written and is extremely important in the review process.

There are three essay sections.

We recommend you address all sections to provide the Faculty Scholarship Committee a broad

understanding of your strengths, interests, and aspirations.

If only one section applies to you, you can complete just one or two of the sections and you will have fulfilled the essay requirement.

Write about events or circumstances that demonstrate:

**Section A:** Academic and personal achievements

**Section B:** Talents, experiences, interests

**Section C:** Personal and career goals

Each Section: 1,700 characters or less, including spaces (approx. ½ page of 12 font, single space).

There is some flexibility for additional characters / spaces.

There is no spell-check. Use Word, plain text, then copy and paste. Use basic formatting (no bullets, indenting, etc. – these distort text).

**NOTE:** Save your information periodically. TritonLink has a timeout feature.

## ► Part VI: Special Circumstances (Optional)

Some scholarships give preference to students with special circumstances.

Examples (but not limited to): Personal or family hardships, re-entry student, single parent, veteran, disabled, etc.

Statement: 2,200 characters or less, including spaces (approx. 2/3 page, single-spaced, 12 point font).

**NOTE:** Save your information periodically. TritonLink has a timeout feature.

## ► Part VII: Certification, Release Agreement, Online Authorization (Required)

Your authorization certifies your information is correct, and you agree to the release statement.

If your application is not complete, you will NOT be shown the Confirmation Page. You will be shown the missing information needed.

## ► Confirmation Page

You must see the Confirmation Page to verify your application is complete.

If you do not receive the Confirmation Page, your application may not be complete or saved.

**Note: Changes to the application can be made at any time up to the February 20, 2012 deadline.**

All scholarships are one-year awards unless stated otherwise.

You may check more than one scholarship if you meet the criteria. However, only **one** scholarship is awarded per student.

Scholarships marked with an asterisk (\*) require supplemental information. A box is provided for this additional information.

## Merit Only Scholarship

All students are considered automatically for this merit award. Awards are up to \$500.

## Restricted Scholarships

Restricted scholarships have additional criteria such as major, leadership, hardship, etc.

The FAFSA should be submitted by March 2, 2012, for financial need awards. (And submit additional requested financial aid documents by May 1, 2012.)

## Financial Need Only Awards

All students are automatically considered for the merit-financial need awards, if they are receiving financial aid.

Financial aid recipients are automatically verified via the Financial Aid data base.

To meet the financial need criterion, students should submit the FAFSA by March 2, 2012 (And submit additional requested financial aid documents by May 1, 2012).

## Scholarships Restricted to Fields of Study

**James W. Barnes Scholarship:** Awarded to full-time current undergraduate students majoring in Mechanical, Electrical, Computer Engineering or Computer Science, with 3.0+ GPA, and financial need. This is a one-year award up to \$2,000. *In the Essay: Provide information about your interest in any of the above majors.*

## **Errett Bishop Scholarship:**

Awarded to declared Mathematics majors, who will be juniors or seniors in 2012-2013, who qualify for financial aid. Preference will be given to students with upper division math course work. This is a one-year award up to \$3,000.

## **Boeing Engineering**

**Scholarship:** Awarded to US Citizens, who are full-time Electrical, Mechanical, Aerospace, Computer Engineering, or Computer Science majors, with demonstrated financial need. This is a one-year award up to \$2,000. *In the Essay: Provide information about your interest in the above majors.*

## **Ken Bowles Scholarship for**

**CSE:** Awarded to full-time Computer Science Engineering majors, who will be seniors in 2012-2013, with a 3.0+ GPA. Preference given students with demonstrated financial need, and who may have knowledge or experience with the UCSD Pascal Application. This is a one-year award up to \$1,500. *In the Essay: Provide information about your interest in Computer Science Engineering, and your knowledge or experience with the Pascal Application.*

## **Gregory T. Bryan**

**Scholarship:** This Alumni Leadership Scholarship is awarded to full-time Social Sciences or Arts & Humanities majors, with a 3.0+ GPA, have demonstrated financial need, and college-level academic,

campus or community service/leadership. This is a two-year undergraduate scholarship of up to \$2,000 annually. *In the Resume and/or Essay: Provide information about your interest in the above major and your community service.*

**Cambon Family Scholarship:**

This Alumni Leadership Scholarship is awarded to full-time Economics majors, with a 3.0+ GPA, have demonstrated financial need, and college-level academic, campus or community service/leadership. This is a two-year undergraduate scholarship up to \$2,000 annually. *In the Resume and/or Essay: Provide information about your interest in the above major and your community service.*

**CK and Jenny Cheng**

**Scholarship:** Awarded to Computer Science, Electrical or Computer Engineering majors, at the Jacobs School of Engineering, based on academic merit. This is a one-year award up to \$500.

**Thomas E. Curtis Scholarship:**

Awarded to Biology, Chemistry, or Physics majors, who are juniors or seniors in 2012-2013, with at least a 3.5 GPA. Must demonstrate interest in the larger world around them with leadership level involvement outside the classroom. This is a one-year award up to \$2,000. *In the Resume and/or Essay: Provide information about your interest in the above major and your community service.*

**William Denman Scholarship:**

Awarded to outstanding students majoring in Philosophy, Comparative Religions, or International Relations. This is a one-year award and the amount varies up to \$1,000. *In the Essay: Provide information about*

*your interest in any of the above majors.*

**Klara D. Eckart Scholarship:**

Awarded to promising students in Computation, Mathematics, or Physics. This is a one-year award and the amount varies up to \$1,000. *In the Essay: Provide information about your interest in any of the above majors.*

**\* Marye Anne Fox and James Whitesell Scholarship:**

Awarded to students majoring in Natural Sciences or Engineering. Preference is given to students with demonstrated financial need, who are dependents of UCSD employees. This is a one-year award and the amount varies. If you are a dependent of a UCSD employee, *in the Part III Supplemental Box provide your parent's name, job position/title, UCSD Department, and Department phone number.*

**Hajim Family Scholarship:**

This Alumni Leadership Scholarship is awarded to full-time current undergraduate students, majoring in Visual Art, with a 3.0+ GPA, have college-level academic, campus or community service/leadership, and demonstrated financial need. This is a two-year undergraduate award up to \$2,000. *In the Resume and/or Essay: Provide information about your interest in the above major and your community service.*

**JAY '93 Undergraduate**

**Scholarship:** Awarded to students majoring in Economics, with a 3.75+ GPA, demonstrated financial need, and preference given to students from Los Angeles County. This is a one-year award and the amount varies up to \$1,800. *In the Essay: Provide information about your interest in the above major.*

**Kyoko Matsuda Scholarship:**

Awarded to undergraduate Physics majors, who plan to teach at the high school level, along with those who are academically invested in teaching Physics, with consideration given to students with financial need. This is a one-year award of up to \$2,000. *In the Essay: Provide Information about your interest in Physics and your career plans to teach at the high school level.*

**Diana C. Miles Scholarship:**

Awarded to outstanding undergraduates majoring in Music. This is a one-year award of up to \$2,000. *In the Essay: Provide information about your interest in the above major.*

**Michael Miller Engineering Scholarship for Transfer**

**Students:** Awarded to transfer students who are Engineering majors, with a 3.0+ GPA, and demonstrated financial need. This is a one-year award of up to \$2,500. *In the Essay: Provide information about your interest in the above major.*

**Karen Moraghan**

**Scholarship:** This Alumni Leadership Scholarship is awarded to full-time Communications majors, with a 3.0+ GPA, demonstrated financial need, and college-level academic, campus or community service/leadership. This is a two-year undergraduate scholarship up to \$2,000 annually. *In the Resume and/or Essay: Provide information about your interest in the above major and your community service.*

**Philip R. & Pamela Fadem Palisoul Scholarship:** This Alumni Leadership Scholarship is awarded to Revelle college undergraduates who have a 3.0+ GPA, demonstrated financial need, majoring in Arts and Humanities, and have demonstrated college-level academic, campus or community service/leadership. This is a two-year undergraduate scholarship up to \$2,000 annually. *In the Resume and/or Essay: Provide information about your interest in the above major and your community service.*

**Albert Parvin Scholarship:** Awarded to Engineering majors, who are qualified and deserving students who are serving, or have served, in the armed forces of the United States. This is a one-year award up to \$1,000. *In the Essay: Provide information about your interest in the above major.*

**Cheryl Renee Persky Memorial Scholarship:** Awarded to Electrical Engineering or Computer Science majors. This is a one-year award and the amount varies. *In the Essay: Provide information about your interest in any of the above majors.*

**Tenie Rimmel Memorial Scholarship:** Awarded to Division of Physical Sciences majors, based on academic merit, who have demonstrated financial need. This is a one-year award of up to \$1,000. *In the Essay: Provide information about your interest in Physical Sciences.*

**Gary C. Reynolds Scholarship:** Awarded to combined Mathematics-Computer Science majors, who will be juniors or seniors in 2012-2013, who show exceptional promise for making

future contributions in their field of study. Prior recipients of this award are not eligible. This is a non-renewable award. The amount of this award varies up to \$1,500. *In the Essay: Provide information about your interest in the above major.*

**Visual Arts Endowment Scholarship:** Awarded to current full-time students. Intended to support talented undergraduate students majoring in Visual Arts. This is a one-year award up to \$4,000. *In the Resume and/or Essay: Provide information about your demonstrated accomplishments in the above field of interest.*

**Sarah Roman Vyse Physics Scholarship:** This Alumni Scholarship is awarded to Physics majors, with a 3.0+ GPA, and demonstrated financial need. This is a two-year undergraduate award, up to \$2,000 annually. *In the Essay: Provide information about your interest in the above major.*

**C. Robert Wartell Memorial Scholarship:** This Alumni Leadership Scholarship is awarded to undergraduate students who have a 3.0+ GPA, demonstrated financial need, college-level academic, campus or community service/leadership, and have demonstrated interest in law or justice. This is a two-year undergraduate scholarship up to \$2,000 annually. *In the Resume and/or Essay: Provide information about your interest in the above field of interest and your community service.*

**Waxman Family Scholarship:** This Alumni Leadership Scholarship is awarded to full-time Mathematics or Biology majors, with a 3.4+ GPA, demonstrated financial need, and

college-level academic, campus or community service/leadership. This is a two-year undergraduate scholarship up to \$2,000 annually. *In the Resume and/or Essay: Provide information about your interest in any of the above majors and your community service.*

**\* Robert and Pat Whalen Military Transfer Scholarship:** Awarded to transfer students who have served in the U.S. Armed Forces as enlisted or non-commissioned officers, have demonstrated financial need, and majoring in Engineering. Preference given to those who have transferred to UCSD through Transfer Admission Guarantee (TAG) or UniversityLink. This is a one-year award and the amount varies. *In the Supplemental Box: Provide information about your military service, verify your status as an enlisted or non-commissioned officer, and if applicable, indicate if you were a TAG or UniversityLink participant.*

## Veterans' Status or Ancestors

**Brython P. Davis Scholarship:** Awarded to students whose parents are or were a regular member of the U.S. Navy or Marine Corps. This is a one-year award and the amount varies. *Verification as a U.S. military descendant is needed only when a scholarship offer is made.*

**LaVerne Noyes Foundation Scholarship:** Awarded to direct descendants of U.S. World War I veterans (i.e. four months of U.S. service prior to November 11, 1918), who qualify for

financial aid. This is a one-year award and the amount varies. *Verification as a U.S. veteran descendant needed only if a scholarship offer is made.*

## Geographic Area

**Bay Area Alumni Scholarship:** This Alumni Leadership Scholarship is awarded to full-time students, with a 3.0+ GPA, with demonstrated financial need, college-level academic, campus or community service/leadership, and has graduated from a high school in the San Francisco Bay Area. This is a two-year undergraduate scholarship up to \$2,000 annually. *In the Resume and/or Essay: Provide information about your community service.*

**Willis & Jane Fletcher Foundation and P and G Company Scholarship:** This outside agency scholarship is awarded to a 2012-2013 sophomore who is a graduate of a San Diego County high school, with demonstrated financial need, and community service. This is a one-year award up to \$2,500. *In the Resume and/or Essay: Provide information about your high school and college community service.*

**Walsh Chacon Scholarship:** This Alumni Leadership Scholarship is awarded to full-time students, with a 3.0+ GPA, demonstrated financial need, college-level academic, campus or community service/leadership, and who come meet one or more of the following requirements: Come from zip codes 92113, 91950, 92154, or 91910; are UCSD Preuss School graduates; or attended the Toussaint Academy of the Arts and Sciences. This is a two-year

undergraduate scholarship up to \$2,000 annually. *In the Resume and/or Essay: Provide information about your community service.*

## Other Restricted Scholarships

**Alumni Leadership Scholarships:** The following Alumni Leadership Scholarships were established by generous UCSD Alumni and are awarded to full-time students, with a 3.0+ GPA, demonstrated financial need, and demonstrated college-level academic, campus or community service/leadership. This is a two-year undergraduate scholarship up to \$2,000 annually. *In the Resume and/or Essay: Provide information about your community service.*

**F. Thomas Bond Revelle College Scholarship:** Awarded to Revelle College students who will be seniors in 2012-2013, have a 3.7+ GPA, and participated in significant extra-curricular campus activity. This is a minimum \$1,000 one-year award. *In the Resume and/or Essay: Provide information about your extra-curricular campus activity.*

**Jaye Haddad Memorial Scholarship:** Awarded to students diagnosed with cancer, Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome (AIDS), AIDS-related conditions, or students with

physical disabilities, and demonstrated financial need. Award amount is up to \$1,000. *In the Special Circumstances Section: Provide information about your health or physical challenges.*

**Kevin T. Hart Memorial Scholarship:** This Alumni Leadership Scholarship is awarded to full-time students, with a 3.0+ GPA, demonstrated financial need, college-level academic, campus or community service/leadership, and has experienced either mental illness or homelessness personally or through experiences of a family member. This is a two-year undergraduate scholarship up to \$2,000 annually. *In the Special Circumstances Section: Provide information about experience with mental illness or homelessness.* *In the Resume and/or Essay: Provide information about your community service.*

**Iranian-American Student's Scholarship:** This outside agency scholarship is awarded to students who are of Iranian or Iranian -American descent with financial need and academic merit. These are one-year awards up to \$1,000. **Note:** Students who check this box will be sent an email around January inviting them to complete a separate Iranian-American Scholarship Application at [www.iasfund.org](http://www.iasfund.org).

**Jeffrey R. Leifer Leadership Scholarship:** Awarded to current students who have demonstrated financial need, academic achievement, are the first generation in their family to attend college, and graduates from California high schools that have historically been underrepresented at UC

campuses. This is a one-year award and the amount varies up to \$1,000. *In the Special Circumstances Section: Provide information about your parents' level of education, and your motivation to attend college as a first generation college student in.*

**Joseph H. Lima Scholarship:** This Alumni Leadership Scholarship is awarded to students with demonstrated financial need, from an immigrant family (student or parents born outside the U.S.), who have immigrated or are immigrating to the U.S., including someone with visa status of "asylee," and have college-level academic, campus or community service/leadership. This is a two-year undergraduate scholarship up to \$2,000 annually. *In the Special Circumstances Section: Provide information required about your immigrant status/experience. In the Resume and/or Essay: Provide information about your community service.*

**Marchick-Rallo Scholarship:** This Alumni Leadership Scholarship is awarded to undergraduates who have a 3.0+ GPA, demonstrated financial need, have college-level academic, campus or community service/leadership, and have or are participating in UCSD Student Government. This is a two-year scholarship up to \$2,000 annually. *In the Resume and/or Essay: Provide information about your UCSD Student Government participation, and community service.*

**George Parker Memorial Scholarship:** Awarded to students with demonstrated financial need, who were orphaned for at least 3 years prior the age of 18, and/or who

were raised in foster care for at least 3 years immediately prior to the age of 18. This is a renewable award, paid in the amount of up to \$2,000 annually. Verification of orphan or foster care status is needed only if a scholarship offer is made. *In the Special Circumstances Section: Provide information about the circumstances in which you became a foster child or orphan, and the challenges you have experienced or overcome.*

**Sven Peterson Memorial Scholarship:** Awarded to a 2012-2013 Warren College sophomore or junior, majoring in an area other than engineering or life sciences, who has been named to the Warren College Provost's Honors list at least one quarter, and has a 3.0+ cumulative GPA. This is a one-year \$2,000 award. Students may reapply.

**Leon T. Roach Academic Scholarship for Athletes:** This Alumni Leadership Scholarship is awarded to undergraduate students with financial need, with a 3.0 GPA, have academic, campus or community leadership experience, and are athletes with one of the Intercollegiate Athletic Teams, with preference to the Men's and Women's Track and Field Team. This is a two-year scholarship up to \$2,000 annually. *In the Resume and/or Essay: Provide information about your athletic involvement.*

**Malcolm R. Stacey Memorial Scholarship:** Scholarship amounts of \$500-\$2,000 are awarded in the following priority.

1. Undergraduate Jewish students who are orphans and preparing for graduate study in aeronautical engineering.

Provide background on your experience as an orphan.

2. Undergraduate Jewish students in the field of aeronautical engineering.
3. Jewish students majoring in engineering.
4. Jewish students in any field of study.

#### \* Student Foundation

**Scholarships:** The Student Foundation Scholarships are one-year awards, ranging from \$1,000-\$1,500, given to continuing UC San Diego students (2012-13) who have demonstrated financial need, and college-level academic, campus or community service and leadership. Students are selected based on their GPA and personal statement. These scholarships are funded by Give. Invest. Gain. donors and the student-supported Student Foundation Endowment Fund. *In Part III Supplemental Box answer these questions: 1) What does philanthropy mean to you? 2) How have you been philanthropic? 3) What philanthropic activities do you plan beyond UCSD?*

**TeamPersona Scholarship:** This Alumni Leadership Scholarship is awarded to Math or Science majors, who are upper division students, with a 3.0 GPA, demonstrated financial need, and history of involvement with organizations benefitting women. This is a two-year award of up to \$2,000 annually. *In the Resume and/or Essay: Provide information about your involvement with organizations benefitting women.*

**\* UC San Diego Faculty-Staff Employee Dependent Scholarship:** Awarded to

students with a 3.0+ GPA, demonstrated financial need, who are daughters or sons of UCSD employees. This is a one-year scholarship and the amount varies. *In the Part III*

*Supplemental Box: Provide your parent's name, job position/title, UCSD Department, and Department phone number.*

### **UCSD Town and Gown**

**Scholarship:** Awarded to full-time 2012-2013 juniors or seniors, with a 3.4+ GPA, demonstrated financial need, who show exceptional promise for making future contributions in public or community service (including but not limited to foreign affairs, medicine, social service, political science). Selection process may include an interview. This is a one year award up to \$5,000. *In the Essay and/or Resume: Provide information about your interest in pursuing a Public Service career or community service.*

### **Vickerman/Munoz Family Scholarship for Transfer**

**Students:** This Alumni Leadership Scholarship is awarded to full-time transfer students, with a 3.0+ GPA, demonstrated financial need, and college-level academic, campus or community service/leadership. This is a two-year undergraduate scholarship up to \$2,000 annually. *In the Resume and/or Essay: Provide information about your community service.*
