The UC Admissions Application is the only scholarship application for prospective students. (Due date November 30<sup>th</sup>)

#### Undergraduate Scholarship Program

Scholarships are awarded on a competitive basis, selected by the UCSD Faculty Committee on Undergraduate Scholarships and Honors.

Although every effort is made to present the most accurate and up-to-date information, the information contained herein is subject to change due to federal, state, and university funding limitations, or changes in policy and procedure.

The phrase “...in the upcoming academic year...,” refers to the 2018-2019 academic year.

#### Who is Eligible?

- ▶ Current 2017-2018 UCSD undergraduates, to be enrolled in the upcoming academic year. Preference for full-time enrollment (fall, winter, spring) in the upcoming academic year.
- ▶ U.S. Citizens or Permanent Residents or UCSD students who are not US Citizens or Permanent Residents, but who are exempt from paying Non-Resident Supplemental Tuition under AB540, may be considered for many UCSD scholarships
- ▶ **GPA & Quarters:** 3.5+ UCSD cum GPA for merit awards, 3.0+ UCSD cum GPA for all other awards, and completed less than 15 quarters

#### Restrictions:

- ▶ Preference is given to students who are not recipients of the Regents, Jacobs, Chancellor's, or Chancellor's Associate Scholarships
- ▶ For financial need scholarships, file a **FAFSA**, or if AB540 eligible-and not able to file a FAFSA, file a **California Dream Application** by **March 2, 2018**. Do Not File Both. (Additional requested financial aid documents due May 21)
- ▶ Generally one UCSD scholarship awarded per student

#### What Does This Application Do?

- Students who submit the above application are automatically added to the candidate pool for consideration for scholarships for which they meet the basic eligibility—e.g. GPA, major, need.
- Other scholarships require students to self-apply

This information is imported. Determined by Units: Sophomore=45+ units, Junior=90+ units, Senior=135+ units

- **Imported Student Data**

Some student information is imported weekly to your application from the student data base. This information includes your name, PID, citizenship, major, GPA, grade level, college, address, etc. You can view this information by clicking on the box Application Record on the bottom left that appears on every page of the application. Although this information may not be immediately visible to you, please check back periodically to view your updated information.

Add leadership titles in appropriate sections.

**Part I:** Academic and personal achievements

**Part II:** Talents, experiences, interests

**Part III:** Personal and career goals

We recommend you address all sections to provide the Scholarship Review Committees a broad understanding of your strengths, interests, and aspirations.

Since these are required fields, if not all "parts" apply to you, enter "Not Applicable"

### Special Circumstances

(300-word limit)

Some scholarships give preference to students with special circumstances. We encourage you to complete this section if applicable.

Examples (but not limited to): Personal, family, or financial hardships, re-entry student, single parent, foster youth, military deployment, disability, employment, etc.

## ► Section 3: Student Certifications (Required)

- Your authorization certifies your information is correct, and you agree to the release statements.
- All sections must be checked off and your name typed in the signature line.

### Scholarships Listed

These scholarships are identified with an asterisk \* in this guideline.

## 2018-2019

The UCSD Undergraduate Scholarship Program anticipates awarding the following scholarships for the 2018-2019 process.

The phrase “...in the upcoming academic year...”, in the scholarship criteria, refers to the 2018-2019 academic year.

*Although every effort is made to present the most accurate information in this publication, this information is subject to change due to federal, state, university funding, and changes in policy or law.*

All scholarships are one-year or two-year awards as noted.

You may apply for more than one scholarship if you meet the criteria. However, generally only one scholarship is awarded per student during the academic year.

Scholarships marked with an asterisk (\*) are “**Apply To**” scholarships - indicating students are required to answer online Supplemental Questions.

### **Financial Aid Requirements**

For scholarships that include financial need as a requirement:

- ▶ File a **FAFSA**
  - ▶ Or - if AB540 eligible - and not able to file a FAFSA, file a **California Dream Application** by March 2, 2018
- Do NOT file both a FAFSA and Dream Application

(Additional requested financial aid documents due May 21)

Financial aid recipients are automatically verified via the UCSD Financial Aid data base.

### **Scholarships Restricted to Fields of Study**

**Charles S. and Cora L. Ash Scholarship:** Awarded based on academic merit and financial need. Preference for students with a major in the Department of Biological Science. This is a one-year award up to \$2,500. *Include career-enhancing information in Employment, Extracurricular, or Volunteer sections. In the Essay provide information about your interest and goals in your major.*

**James W. Barnes Scholarship:** Awarded to Mechanical, Electrical, Computer Engineering or Computer Science majors, with 3.0+ cum GPA, and financial need. *This is a one-year award up to \$2,000. Include career-enhancing information in Employment, Extracurricular, or Volunteer sections. In the Essay provide information about your interest and goals in your major.*

**Errett Bishop Scholarship:** Awarded to Mathematics majors, who will be juniors or seniors in the upcoming academic year, with demonstrated financial need. Preference will be given to students with upper division math course work. This is a one-year award up to \$3,000. *Include career-enhancing information in Employment, Extracurricular, or Volunteer sections. In the Essay provide*

*information about your interest and goals in your major.*

**Ken Bowles Scholarship for CSE:** Awarded to full-time Computer Science Engineering majors, who will be seniors in the upcoming academic year, with a 3.0+ cum GPA. Preference given to students with demonstrated financial need. Optional: Preference also give to students who may have knowledge or experience with the UCSD Pascal Application (not a requirement). This is a one-year award up to \$1,500. *In the Essay provide information about your interest and goals in your major. Optional: Describe your experience with the UCSD Pascal Application.*

**Gregory T. Bryan Alumni Scholarship:** Awarded to full-time juniors or seniors in the upcoming academic year, who are Social Sciences or Arts & Humanities majors, with a 3.0+ cum GPA, have demonstrated financial need, and college-level academic, campus or community service / leadership. This is a two-year undergraduate scholarship of up to \$2,000 annually. *Include one or more Extracurricular Activity and/or Volunteer Services. In the Essay provide information about your interest in your major and your community involvement.*

**\* James R. Bunch Mathematics Scholarship:** Awarded to students who will be juniors or seniors in the upcoming academic year, who are Applied or Computational

Mathematics majors, with a 3.0+ cum GPA. It is recommended, **but not required**, that applicants have enrolled in Math sequence 170-179 and supply a Faculty recommendation letter. Preference for California residents with demonstrated financial need. This is a one-year award up to \$3,000. *Include career-enhancing information in Employment, Extracurricular, or Volunteer sections.* Under the Supplemental Questions:

1) What are your career goals in Applied and/or Computational Mathematics? 2) How will this scholarship help you attain your goals?

#### **Cambon Family Alumni**

**Scholarship:** Awarded to full-time Economics majors, with a 3.0+ cum GPA, have demonstrated financial need, and college-level academic, campus or community service/leadership. This is up to a two-year undergraduate scholarship up to \$2,000 annually. *Include one or more Extracurricular Activities and/or Volunteer Service.* Under Essay provide information about your interest in your major and your community involvement.

#### **CK and Jenny Cheng**

**Scholarship:** Awarded to Computer Science, Electrical or Computer Engineering majors, at the Jacobs School of Engineering, based on academic merit. This is a one-year award up to \$1,000. *Include career-enhancing information in Employment, Extracurricular, or Volunteer sections.* In the Essay provide information about your interest and goals in your major.

#### **Milane Christiansen**

**Scholarship:** Awarded to Literature majors based on academic merit. This is a one-year award up to \$2,000.

*Include career-enhancing information in Employment, Extracurricular, or Volunteer sections.* In the Essay provide information about your interest and goals in your major.

#### **Thomas E. Curtis Scholarship:**

Awarded to Biology, Chemistry, or Physics majors, who are juniors or seniors in upcoming academic year, with at least a 2.75 cum GPA. Must demonstrate interest in the larger world around them with leadership level involvement outside the classroom. This is a one-year award up to \$2,000. *Include career-enhancing information in Employment, Extracurricular, or Volunteer sections.* In the Essay provide information about your interest and goals in your major and your demonstrated interest and leadership involvement outside the classroom.

#### **William Denman Scholarship:**

Awarded to outstanding Philosophy, Comparative Religions, or International Relations majors. This is a one-year award and the amount varies up to \$3,000. *Include Employment, Extracurricular, or Volunteer work related to your field of study.* Under Essay provide information about your interest and goals in your major.

#### **Klara D. Eckart Scholarship:**

Awarded to promising Computation (Computer Science), Mathematics, or Physics majors. This is a one-year award and the amount varies up to \$2,000. *Include career-enhancing information in Employment, Extracurricular, or Volunteer sections.* In the Essay provide information about your interest and goals in your major.

#### **\* Marye Anne Fox and James Whitesell**

**Scholarship:** Awarded to Natural Sciences or Engineering majors. Preference for students with demonstrated financial need, and dependents of UCSD employees. This is a one-year award up to \$5,000. In the Essay provide information about your interest and goals in your major. *If you are a dependent of a UCSD employee, under Supplemental Questions provide your parent's name, UCSD job position/title, UCSD Department, and Department phone number.*

#### **\* Mrs. Luna and Dr. Y.C.**

**Fung Scholarship:** Awarded to full-time current undergraduates who are or plan to study abroad, are Engineering or Physics majors, with a 3.0+ GPA. Preference for full-year study abroad and demonstrated financial need. This is a one-year award up to \$5,000. *In the Essay provide information about your interest and goals in your major.* Under Supplemental Questions provide confirmation on your current or pending study abroad participation and your interest in studying abroad.

#### **Murray Goodman**

**Undergraduate Scholarship:** Awarded to students with a major in the Department of Chemistry or Biochemistry, with a 3.0+ GPA, and demonstrated financial need. This is a one-year award up to \$2,000. *Include career-enhancing information in Employment, Extracurricular, or Volunteer sections.* In the Essay provide information about your interest and goals in your major.

### **Sudha and Kosal Krishnan**

**PhD '93 Scholarship:** This Alumni Leadership Scholarship is awarded to full-time juniors or seniors in the upcoming academic year, who are Structural Engineering majors, with a 3.0+ cum GPA, have college-level academic, campus or community service/leadership, and demonstrated financial need. The award is up to \$2,000 per year, for up to two years. Include one or more Extracurricular and/or Volunteer Service activity. In the Essay provide information about your interest in your major and your community involvement.

### **Hajim Family Alumni**

**Scholarship:** This Alumni Leadership Scholarship is awarded to full-time juniors or seniors in the upcoming academic year, who are Visual Art majors, with a 3.0+ cum GPA, have college-level academic, campus or community service/leadership, and demonstrated financial need. The award is up to \$2,000 per year, for up to two years. Include one or more Extracurricular and/or Volunteer Service activity. In the Essay provide information about your interest in your major and your community involvement.

### **\* Philip and Elizabeth Hiestand Scholarship for Transfer Engineering Students:**

Awarded to U.S. citizen Transfer students, who are Engineering majors, with a 3.0+ cum GPA, and demonstrated financial need. Preference for students who served in the US military. This is a one-year award up to \$4,000. Include Employment, Extracurricular, or Volunteer work related to your major. In the Essay provide information about your interest and goals in your major. Under Supplemental Questions provide

information about your military service.

### **E. Coke Hill Scholarship:**

Awarded based on academic merit and financial need. Preference for students with a major in the Department of Social Sciences. This is a one-year award up to \$2,500. Include career-enhancing information in Employment, Extracurricular, or Volunteer sections. In the Essay provide information about your interest and goals in your major.

### **\*JAY '93 Undergraduate**

**Scholarship:** Awarded to Economics majors, with a 3.75+ cum GPA, demonstrated financial need, and preference given to students from Los Angeles County. This is a one-year award and the amount varies up to \$2,000. Include career-enhancing information in Employment, Extracurricular, or Volunteer sections. In the Essay provide information about your interest and goals in your major. Under Supplemental Questions indicate if you are a student from Los Angeles County.

### **Alice M. Marriott Scholarship:**

Awarded based on academic merit and financial need. Preference for students with a major in the Department of Biological Science. This is a one-year award up to \$2,500. Include Employment, Extracurricular, or Volunteer work related to your major. In the Essay provide information about your interest and goals in your major.

### **Diana C. Miles Scholarship:**

Awarded to UCSD students with demonstrated, active interest and involvement in Music and/or are Music majors. This is a one-year award up to \$3,000. In the Essay provide information

about your demonstrated interest in music. Under Supplemental Questions describe your interest, involvement, accomplishments in music.

### **\*Stanley E. Mills Memorial Scholarship:**

Awarded to Microbiology majors or related fields, with a 3.0+ cum GPA. Preference will be given to students interested in studying nutrition or aging. This is a one-year award up to \$3,000. Under Supplemental Questions provide information about your interest in studying nutrition or aging.

### **Karen Moraghan Alumni**

**Scholarship:** Awarded to Communications majors, who are full-time juniors or seniors in the upcoming academic year, with a 3.0+ cum GPA, demonstrated financial need, and college-level academic, campus or community service/leadership. This is a two-year undergraduate scholarship up to \$2,000 annually. Include career-enhancing information in Employment, Extracurricular, or Volunteer sections. In the Essay provide information about your interest and goals in your major and your community involvement.

### **Philip R. & Pamela Fadem Palisoul Alumni Scholarship:**

Awarded to Revelle college, full-time juniors or seniors in the upcoming academic year, who have a 3.0+ cum GPA, have demonstrated financial need, who are Arts and Humanities majors, and have demonstrated college-level academic, campus or community service/leadership. This is a two-year undergraduate scholarship up to \$2,000 annually. Include

career-enhancing information in Employment, Extracurricular, or Volunteer sections. In the Essay provide information about your interest and goals in your major and your community involvement.

**\* Albert Parvin Scholarships:** Awarded to Engineering majors, qualified and deserving students who have or are serving in the Armed Forces of the United States. This is a one to two-year award up to \$3,500. Include career-enhancing information in Employment, Extracurricular, or Volunteer sections. In the Essay provide information about your interest and goals in your major. Under Supplemental Questions provide information about your US military service.

**Cheryl Renee Persky Memorial Scholarship:** Awarded to Electrical Engineering or Computer Science majors. This is a one-year award up to \$2,000. Include career-enhancing information in Employment, Extracurricular, or Volunteer sections. In the Essay provide information about your interest and goals in your major.

**Vi and Quang Pham '06 Scholarship:** Awarded to full-time juniors or seniors in the upcoming academic year, 3.0 GPA, majoring in Science, Economics, or Engineering, who have career-enhancing experiences in any or a combination of the following: Research internships, work and/or volunteer activities. Preference will be given to students with a family income between \$65,000 and \$100,000. This is a one-year award up to \$2,000. Include career-enhancing information in Employment, Extracurricular, or Volunteer sections. In the Essay

provide information about your interest and goals in your major.

**Tenie Rimmel Memorial Scholarship:** Awarded to Division of Physical Sciences majors (majors include: CH (Chemistry), MA (Math), PY (Physics) and ES (Environmental Systems). Award based on academic merit, and demonstrated financial need. This is a one-year award of up to \$2,000. Include career-enhancing information in Employment, Extracurricular, or Volunteer sections. In the Essay provide information about your interest and goals in your major.

**Gary C. Reynolds Scholarship:** Awarded to combined Mathematics-Computer Science majors, who will be juniors or seniors in the upcoming academic year, who show exceptional promise for making future contributions in their field of study. Prior recipients of this award are not eligible. This is a non-renewable award. The amount of this award varies up to \$1,500. Include career-enhancing information in Employment, Extracurricular, or Volunteer sections. In the Essay provide information about your interest and goals in your major.

**William F. Rogers, Jr. Scholarship:** Awarded based on academic merit with a preference for students majoring in Social Sciences. This is a one-year award up to \$2,500. Include career-enhancing information in Employment, Extracurricular, or Volunteer sections. In the Essay provide information about your interest and goals in your major.

**\* Italo Scanga Memorial Scholarship:** Awarded to Visual Arts majors. This is a one-year award up to \$2,000. Include

career-enhancing information in Employment, Extracurricular, or Volunteer sections. In the Essay provide information about your interest and goals in your major. Request a Faculty recommendation letter, uploaded to the online application, regarding your work.

**William W. Stout Memorial Scholarship:** Awarded based on academic merit with a preference for students majoring in Arts and Humanities. This is a one-year award up to \$2,500. Include career-enhancing information in Employment, Extracurricular, or Volunteer sections. In the Essay provide information about your interest and goals in your major.

**\*Town and Gown Scholarship (UCSD):** This scholarship sponsored by Elizabeth and Joseph Taft is awarded to full-time juniors or seniors in the upcoming academic year, with a 3.4+ cum GPA, majoring in History or Engineering, with demonstrated financial need, who show exceptional promise for making future contributions in public or community service (including but not limited to foreign affairs, medicine, social service, and political science). Selection process may include an interview. This is a one year award up to \$5,000. In Essay indicate your interest and goals in your major. Under Supplemental Questions provide information about your interest and goals in pursuing a Public Service career or community service.

**\* Alan Turing Memorial Scholarship:** The Center for Networked Systems will award

the Alan Turing Memorial Scholarship to enrolled undergraduate students majoring in Computer Science, Computer or Electrical Engineering, Communications, or Political Science/Public Policy and other programs touching on networked systems, who are also active in supporting the LGBT community. Preference given to students with experience or interest in research, with demonstrated academic merit and financial need. If desired, the recipient will have an opportunity to get involved with a CNS-related research project. This is a one-year award up to \$2,500. *Include information in the Employment, Extracurricular, or Volunteer sections. In the Essay describe your interest and goals in your major. Under Supplemental Questions provide information about how you have actively supported the LGBT community. All information provided in the Supplemental Questions section is **confidential**, and can be reviewed only by the LGBT Scholarship Committee.*

**\* Alice C. Tyler Scholarship - Honoring Sally Ride:** Awarded to students who have demonstrated a commitment to the advancement of women in science, technology, engineering, and/or mathematics, who are Physical Sciences, Mechanical or Aerospace Engineering, Earth Sciences, or Ecology, Behavior and Evolution majors, and have demonstrated financial need and academic merit. This is a one-year award up to \$5,000. *In the Essay provide information about your interest and goals in your major. Under Supplemental Questions, provide information about your demonstrated commitment to the advancement of women in science, technology, engineering, and/or mathematics.*

**\*UJIMA Network Black History Month Scholarship:** Awarded to currently enrolled full-time UCSD undergraduates who have declared an African American Studies minor. This scholarship recognizes academic and creative achievements of African Americans, their history and culture through either a research paper or publicly presented creative work or presentation. This is a one-year award up to \$2,500. *Under Supplemental Questions: Request a faculty recommendation letter, and upload a creative work, project, or presentation.*

**Volt Alumni Scholarship:** Awarded to full-time juniors or seniors in the upcoming academic year, who are Engineering or Arts & Humanities majors, with a 3.0+ cum GPA, demonstrated financial need, demonstrated college-level academic, campus, or community service/ leadership. This is a two-year undergraduate award, up to \$2,000 annually. *Include career-enhancing information in Employment, Extracurricular, or Volunteer sections. In the Essay provide information about your interest and goals in your major and your community involvement.*

**Sarah Roman Vyse Physics Alumni Scholarship:** Awarded to Physics majors, who are full-time juniors or seniors in the upcoming academic year, with a 3.0+ cum GPA, and demonstrated financial need. This is a two-year undergraduate award, up to \$2,000 annually. *Include career-enhancing information in Employment, Extracurricular, or Volunteer sections. In the Essay provide information about your interest and goals in your major and your community involvement.*

**\* C. Robert Wartell Memorial Alumni Scholarship:** Awarded to full-time juniors or seniors in the upcoming academic year, who have a 3.0+ cum GPA, demonstrated financial need, college-level academic, campus or community service/leadership, and have demonstrated interest in law or justice. This award is up to \$2,000, and up two-years. *Include one or more Extracurricular and/or Volunteer Service activity. In the Essay provide information about your interest and goals in your major and your community involvement. Under Supplemental Questions include information about your participation, activities, or goals related to law or justice.*

**\* Robert and Pat Whalen Military Transfer Scholarship:** Awarded to Transfer students who have served in the U.S. Armed Forces as enlisted or non-commissioned officers, have demonstrated financial need, and Engineering majors. Preference given to those who have transferred to UCSD through UniversityLink. This is a one-year award up to \$2,000. *Include career-enhancing information in Employment, Extracurricular, or Volunteer sections. In the Essay provide information about your interest and goals in your major. Under Supplemental Questions include information about your military services/status.*

**\* Gabriele Wienhausen Biological Science Scholarship:** Awarded to Biological Science majors, with a 3.0+ GPA, emphasis on research experience and/or employment, extracurricular activities related to Biological

Sciences. A faculty or supervisor recommendation letter uploaded to your online application is required. This is a one-year award up to \$2,000. *Include career-enhancing information in Employment, Extracurricular, or Volunteer sections. In the Essay provide information about your interest and goals in your major. Complete information under Supplemental Questions.*

**\* Bebe and Marvin Zigman Scholarship:** Awarded to undergraduates born in California, who are Arts or Humanities majors, are meaningfully involved in Foreign Language study, with a 3.0+ cum GPA, and financial need. This is a one-year award up to \$2,000. *Include Employment, Extracurricular, or Volunteer work related to your major. Under Supplemental Questions provide information about your interest and involvement in foreign language study and confirmation that you were born in California.*

## Veterans' Status or Ancestors

**\*Brython P. Davis Scholarship:** Awarded to students whose parents are or were a regular member of the U.S. Navy or Marine Corps. This is a one-year award up to \$1,000. Note: *Verification as a U.S. military descendant is needed only when a scholarship offer is made.*

**\*LaVerne Noyes Foundation Scholarship:** Awarded to direct descendants of U.S. World War I veterans (i.e. four months of U.S. service prior to November 11, 1918), who qualify for financial aid. This is a one-year award and the amount varies, up to \$1,000. Note: *Verification as a U.S.*

*veteran descendant needed only if a scholarship offer is made.*

## Geographic Area

**\*Bay Area Alumni Scholarship:** Awarded to full-time juniors or seniors in the upcoming academic year, with a 3.0+ cum GPA, with demonstrated financial need, college-level academic, campus or community service/leadership, and has graduated from a high school in the San Francisco Bay Area.
